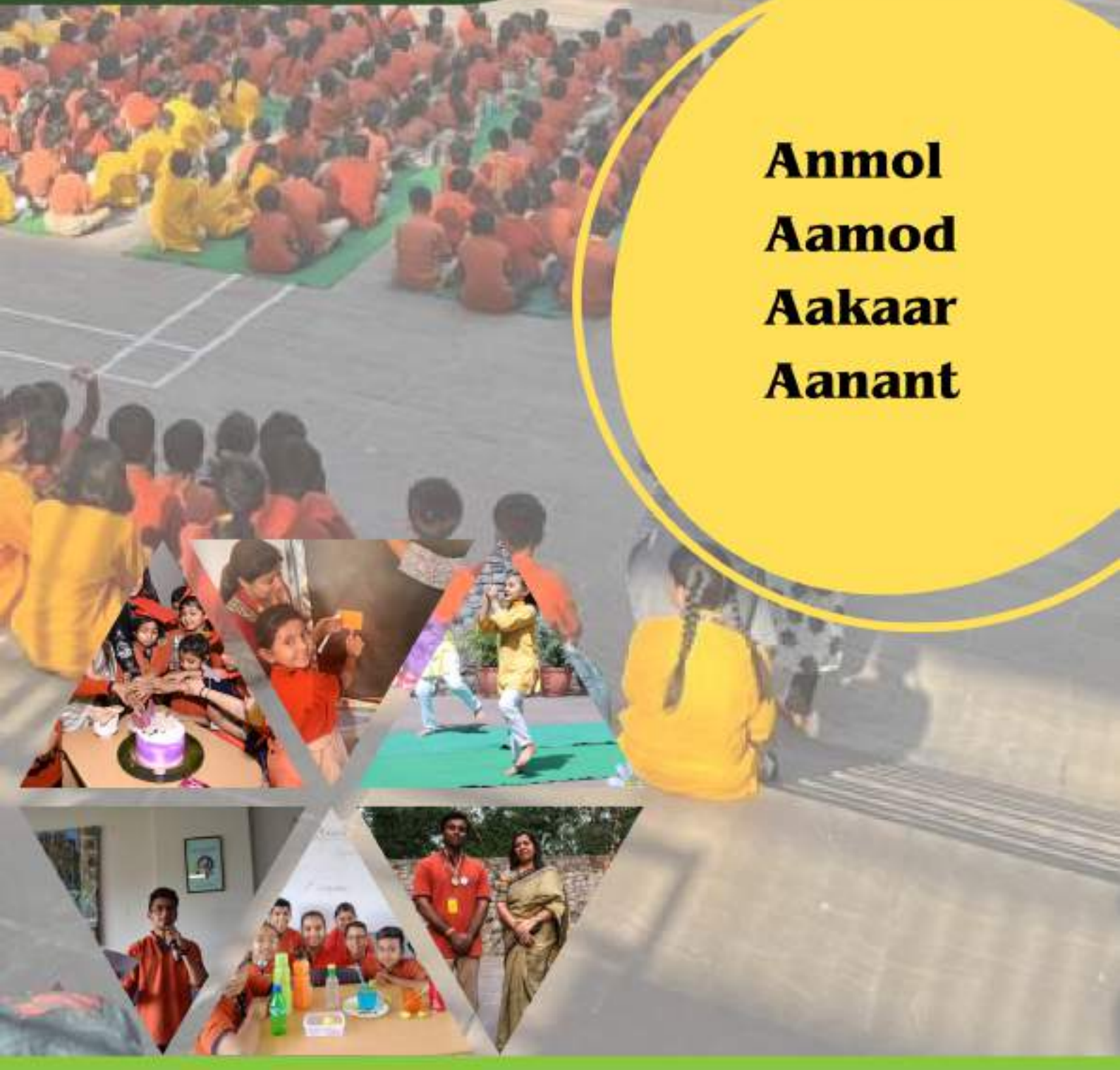

The hall was filled with the air of anticipation and curiosity of parents and students. Going with the Manuskriti culture the day began with the beautiful chanting of Gayatri mantra followed by the reflections of the previous year by the students who had some beautiful anecdotes to share. A student shared how he pictures the physics & chemistry educators to be his superheroes, always being present to solve the doubts. Principal ma'am, Ms. Jyoti Bhalla pointed out the need for children to manage their time by dividing it into 3 colors using the 8-8-8 rule where one dedicates 8 hours to sleep, 8 hours to academics and the remaining 8 to 3Bs, 3Fs, and 3Ss. These signify the other important dimensions of one's life - Health, Hygiene and Hobbies, Family, Friends and Faith, and Soul, Service and Smile. She also emphasized the need to prioritise one's goals by sharing Warren Buffett's strategy where one pens down 25 goals in order and focuses on the first 5, eliminating the rest 20. Headmistress, Ms. Vijaya Sethi took over the orientation and stressed upon the need for regularity and consistency in studies through regular assessments. She also forbade parents from allowing students to carry mobile phones in the premises, while also keeping a check on the screen time of their children. She encouraged them to play an active role in their child's life by engaging with them. All faculty educators were introduced, giving them a chance to discuss the "path to success" that they would follow in the coming session and their expectation of cooperation from parents, who can help with regular and knowledgeable interactions and timely feedbacks which will keep them updated and involved in their child's academic journey.

How Artificial Intelligence can transform education
